Erika Simpson, an Associate Professor of International Relations at Western University, earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Saskatchewan and a doctorate from the University of Toronto. After a postdoctoral fellowship and teaching at Ottawa's Carleton University, Simpson joined Western in 1995 as an assistant professor. Her research focuses on international relations and international security, with an emphasis on nuclear proliferation, the control of weapons of mass destruction, NATO, Canadian defence and foreign policy, and terrorism.

In 2015, Simpson received the Shirley Farlinger Award for Peace Writings by Canadian Voice of Women for Peace, an NGO with consultative status at the UN, and she serves as the the Vice-President of the Canadian Peace Research Association. She also serves on the Board as the Past Vice-Chair and Treasurer of the Canadian Pugwash Group, the national affiliate of the International Pugwash Conferences on Science and World Affairs.

Simpson has written one book, *NATO and the Bomb*, and numerous scholarly articles, essays, and opinion pieces. She has supervised over 30 graduate students and advised the thesis work of many doctoral students in the department's political science program. Most recently she served for two years as a SSHRCC Insight Grant adjudicator and as a Canadian Institute for Military and Veteran Health peer reviewer. She has written for Ottawa's *Embassy Magazine*, *The Hill-Times*, Toronto's *Globe and Mail* and her syndicated Postmedia column appears throughout Ontario.
